WHAT HAS BEEN GOING ON WITH PARENTS OF PRIESTS?

With the onset of the Covid-19 virus, the officers of the Parents of Priests (POP) had to hold a virtual meeting to bring about the transition of officers for 2020-2022. The transition officially took place July 1, 2020. Lou Trenta became President; Don Trask, Vice President, Micki Trenta, Secretary; and Ed Suszynski remains as Treasurer. Mary Ann Trask continues publishing the POP Newsletter and handles the POP Facebook page. Laura Retar keeps track of the deaths of diocesan priests and POP members, and is our Sunshine Person—wishing ‘get well soon cards’ and offering prayers.

The officers started the process to change Parents of Priests information with the State of Ohio and the IRS. We worked with Huntington Bank on signature authorizations and access to the POP accounts. We are in the process of changing our business address to the Diocesan Vocation Office so that it doesn't need to be changed every time the officers are changed.

Don Trask and Mary Avenoso have begun the work on the ‘25 Club’, and leadership on the program was transferred to Lou Trenta, with Don Trask continuing as advisor/coach. Since the social activities of the POP had been cancelled due to Covid-19, distribution of the tickets and sellers packets had to be by mail, first to those who were listed as sellers of multiple tickets and then to those who had not listed a seller other than themselves. Then, letters were sent to about 70 pastors asking them to participate and to put information about the 25 Club in their parish publication.

Lou Trenta uses email to communicate approximately weekly with about 75 members who have shared their emails. Usually the emails are about requests for prayers for clergy and parents of priest and/or notice of deaths of priests, deacons, and/or POP members, but they also include new developments and ideas. There are about 95 members who either do not have email or who have not shared their email addresses. Those members receive letters or postcards to inform them of information shared in the emails. Since the mailing of letters cost POP over \$50 per mailing, each letter will summarize several weeks' worth of email communications.

Lou read many files and documents from the past of Parents of Priest and has shared much of that information. Recognition of what POP has accomplished has led to an effort to recapture some of the widespread involvement in the POP. There are many opportunities for both fun and altruistic activities. We can be both social and supportive.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF PARENTS OF PRIESTS



THE STORY OF A SEED

45 years ago a seed was planted, and has grown into a beautiful tree whose branches continue to grow. Look closely at the branches, many names are carved with pride .

May we continue to branch out and do the same for others.

On June 11, 1974, the parents of the newly ordained priests gathered for a Liturgy of Thanksgiving and dinner. One mother in particular looked around the room at all the smiling faces. Her name was Theresa Snedeker. She thought to herself: "Tonight we will say goodnight, and our friendships may be gone. Something must be done."

In August of 1975, Theresa wrote to Bishop James Hickey about initiating an organization involving parents of priests who would support and encourage vocations to the priesthood. Bishop Hickey was receptive and interested and asked Theresa to see Fr. Anthony Pilla,

In early September of '75 the parents of the '74 ordination class began meeting at each other's homes, sharing ideas and planning for the future.

In February of 1976, POP met for the second official meeting.

1976 brought us a newly retired priest as our first chaplain, Fr. Joseph Buescher. He liked the idea of the organization using P.O.P. as their initials, but he strongly urged the parents never to call themselves "POP" He told them to use and say "Parents of Priests" with pride, because with the Lords help they had an important part in the development of vocations.

The "25 Club" was to become a major source of income for the works of charity that P.O.P. would perform.

A 90's update - the seminaries gave P.O.P a framed plaque of recognition for all the work done for them.

The neat thing was how Parents of Priests always incorporated laughter and fun into all they do. Every summer families gathered together for Mass; picnic, games (even a water balloon toss) and many lively discussions.

In 1983 a logo was designed and accepted. The Parents of Priests banner was made for the tenth anniversary in 1985.

In April of 1988 an article about the organization was written for the St. Anthony Messenger. Members were interviewed and the spirit of Parents of Priests was truly captured. Other parents from all over the US asked for information that would help them to start such a group.

The seed that was planted has grown 45 years into a wonderful organization that supports and prays daily for our priest sons. God is good, and all the time, God is good.

Thanks to all the priests, parents and sisters who have helped us thru the years.
